
While I'm on that topic, my security system backup battery just failed. This is an easy do-it-yourself replacement task. Locally, Interstate Battery (612 Geneva Rd.) carries replacements (CA1240 12v battery) for about \$30. You can also find

> it cheaper on-line, but I like to support local businesses when I can, and they have the battery in stock.

> We've made some new improvements in the Amenity Center, including three new treadmills and a flat-screen TV. We're also trying to keep ahead of the damage (and outright vandalism!) in the pool area. Covenants Corner

Summer is in full swing in the Sanctuary. Many neighbors are out and about enjoying the numerous activities The Sanctuary has to offer. If you or your children enjoy visiting the retention ponds, please remember there is no wading or swimming permitted. Caution your children that dangers may be present in and around the ponds (poisonous snakes and, possibly, alligators) and dangerous bacteria and other organisms that can cause serious illness live in the water.

While enjoying the ponds, please respect the private property of homeowners who live around the ponds and confine your activities to the common area, not someone's yard. Use the pond access points and not neighbor's yards to get down to the water. Fishing is permitted in all ponds except the two with fountains.

Many of you have repaired the damage to your lawns caused by last winter's extremely cold weather. With the summer rains and high temperatures, chinch bugs are once again making their presences known in some lawns. Chinch bug damage is one of the major causes of sod loss and should receive immediate attention as soon as the damage first appears. Quick action could keep these bugs from destroying your entire lawn and possibly your neighbor's lawn as well. The University of Florida Extension Service recommends products containing Sevin for control of these pests.

If you are painting the exterior of your home and or making major landscape changes, you are required to obtain ARC approval before you begin. The Sanctuary approved color palette from which to select your paint colors is avail-

able at the Amenities Center. ARC applications can be found on the website. Since the ARC meets only once a month, apply early so that when you are ready to do the project or hire a contractor you already have your approval. An approved ARC application is valid for one year to allow you time to execute your plans.

Trash cans stored in the driveway is a violation of the Covenants and continue to be a significant problem in The Sanctuary. Those large trash cans are unsightly and many find it difficult to fit them in the garage. If you have to leave your trash can(s) outside, it needs to be placed at the side of your home **behind proper screening**, not on the driveway. Before you can leave your trash can outside, you need to submit an ARC application with a detailed design of a landscape screen or utility fence

to screen the can from all views from the street and from your neighbor.

Parking on the street is hazardous to children, walkers, and runners and is prohibited by the Covenants. Residents are required to park all their vehicles either in the garage or on the driveway. On street parking is permitted only for visitors and guests and is limited to 6 hours. Please be courteous to your neighbors and park in your driveway or garage.

Hi Neighbors,

Just wanted to give you a 2^{nd} quarter

update from the Real Estate corner. We currently have 23 homes on the market in The Sanctuary, 17 are traditional sales, and 6 are short sales. No foreclosure homes are on the market at this time.

On the sales side for the 2nd quarter we sold 10 homes compared to 17 at this time last year. Of the 10 that sold in the last quarter, 2 were traditional sales, 4 were short sales and 4 were foreclosures. Of the 17 homes that sold in 2009 2nd quarter, 11 were traditional sales, 3 short sale & 3 foreclosures.

The sold price per sq ft range for 2010 is from \$82.99 to \$129.07. The 2nd quarter 2009 price per sq ft range is \$83.36 to \$128.71. The good news is that 2009 and 2010 sold price per sq. ft. has remained in the same range.

During the last week in June all residents should have received a notification letter from DEVCON encouraging the testing of your security system along with an Activation Agreement to update their information for monitoring your system.

This FORM MUST BE COMPLETED and returned to Devcon so that their system can be updated with your most current information. In so doing, The Sanctuary HOA will get an accurate count of the homes that are being monitored when billed for this service.

Please make sure you indicate your current contact information along with telephone numbers and confirmed password.

Also indicate if there are any special instructions such as disabled or wheelchair bound persons so that this information can be forwarded to fire or police if necessary.

Any resident who does not have their system activated can do so at this time at NO COST.

Residents may also purchase an Extended Service Program for \$6.99/month, which covers all parts (except battery) and labor should your system fail for any reason.

If you did not receive this notification please stop by the clubhouse and copies will be available for you.

Learn to Laugh in Another Language... Host a Foreign Student

Hosting A Foreign Exchange Student

Foreign exchange students come in all sizes and shapes, and from many different countries. Students who have been accepted in the International Student Exchange (ISE) program are very excited about having been selected. They anticipate learning more about the U.S. and they know the year will be rewarding, not just because of school courses they take and new friends they make, but because they will live in an American home as a member of an American host family.

Although host families, too, come in many shapes and sizes, they have in common the desire to share their homes with bright, responsible teens from other countries. They welcome the opportunity to become surrogate families for these students.

Host families and exchange students learn from each other during their months living together. When the school year ends, both are amazed and sad that the time has flown by so fast. But that typically is not the end of it. Friendships forged during a year filled with warmth, fun and mutual respect continue long after the last good-bye.

A host family may be traditional (father, mother, one or more children) or it may be retirees or empty nesters. A host family may be headed by a single parent. Host families may wish to have

not just one but two exchange students; in this case the only stipulation is that students must be from different countries and have a different native tongue.

Host families choose their exchange students. One family might wish to open their home to a student from Thailand or Sweden – countries about which they know very little but want to learn more. Another family might like to host a student who is interested in a particular sport or plays a musical instrument, regardless of the student's nationality.

Complete student profiles that include photographs, references, and all relevant records are provided to the host family so they can make an informed selection.

In any given year, ISE successfully places more students in the U.S. than any other organization offering similar programs. ISE currently has more than 25 fully screened and qualified students from Asia, South America and Europe who hope to come to the Orlando area for the 2010/2011 school year.

If you and your family would like to become a host family for a student from another country, please contact Barbara Philbeck, the Orlando Area ISE Representative, at 407-340-0840 or at bphilbeck517@gmail.com. Barbara will provide information and insight into all aspects of the ISE program, including her ongoing role with host families and stu-

dents throughout the school year. Barbara has taught exchange students herself and knows what questions prospective host families frequently have.

If you know of families not living in our immediate community who are interested in hosting a student, you might want to pass this article and Barbara's contact information on to them.

ISE is a not-for-profit organization. The Council on Standards for International Educational Travel has listed ISE each year since ISE was founded almost 30 years ago. The United States Department of State has designated ISE a sponsor of the Exchange Visitor Program.

Garbage Bin Placement 101

Garbage pickup is still having trouble with homeowners who don't place their garbage bins properly at the curb. The picture shows the right way to do it.

Just roll it down to the edge of the curb. Arrows on the lid should point toward the street. That puts the handles nearest the sidewalk. It won't roll into the street, so don't turn it sideways.

Put it on the driveway side away from your mail box. The pickup truck has big claws that swing out to grab the bin and will grab anything else that is too close by, including the mail box, and attempt to lift it up and over the truck. Place your recycle bins far enough away so they do not get grabbed also.

Pick up of household items too large for the garbage bin, furniture, appliances, carpet (no greater than 6' x 10', rolled and weighing less than 50 lbs.) grills and other big stuff, may be sched-

uled for collection by calling 407-293-8000.

Garbage pick up is on Wednesday; yard trash day is Thursday. Remember to

put your bins away afterwards.

If you wish to reserve the Amenity Center clubhouse room or schedule a pool party you must call the Amenity Center office at 407-971-9749. Reservations must be made at least one week in advance of the event. There is a \$100 security deposit, a \$50 rental fee, with a maximum of 25 people (total count of adults and children), and a three hour time limit. Rental of the Amenity Center clubhouse room and pool area are for residents and their guests only.

County High Schools Are Tops in U.S.

Seminole County Schools' four-year high schools placed in the top 3 percent of the nation, according to a Newsweek magazine ranking.

The county's high schools have been in the top 5 percent every year since the index was established in 2004.

"America's Best High Schools" list includes Seminole, Lyman, Hagerty, Winter Springs, Lake Mary, Oviedo, Lake Brantley, Lake Howell and Crooms. Hagerty qualified this year with its first class of graduating seniors in 2009.

Newsweek ranks the nation's more than 27,000 public high schools based on a ratio of students taking advanced placement and/or international baccalaureate tests to the number of students graduating that year.

All schools on the top list of 1,600 schools have a ratio of at least 1 to 1; at least as many tests were given as there were graduates for that school. By this calculation, these schools are in the top 6 percent of public high schools nationwide. Seminole County Schools are among the top 810 schools in this group.

Please Consider the Following

PLEASE CONSIDER REPLACING OR PAINTING YOU CURRENT HOUSE NUMBERS BLACK: According to the Oviedo Police officers who patrol our area the builder-installed brass house numbers are difficult to see at night time. Since they are beginning to tarnish and many homeowners have asked about alternatives, the ARC has approved black numbers, as well.

There goes the neighborhood habitat.

If you wish to switch to black numbers, most area hardware stores have them, or you may paint your existing brass numbers black. The font style should be the same as existing numbers. No ARC application is required.

In addition, if your mail box does not have numbers on the side, you may want to consider putting numbers on it as well. This will really help make "Your" address show up more when someone is trying to locate your house. You can also obtain The Sanctuary-standard mailbox numbers (the large reflective type) from Creative Mail

Boxes (800-804-4809).

Another option to help others find your home would be by adding a house number plaque. New plaques require ARC approval prior to installation. Plaques should be bronze or bronze-like, with dull or shiny bronze numbers (black numbers also are acceptable). Acceptable shapes are rectangular or oval. No additional colors should appear on the plaque. Get an ARC application off our web-site.

Please note that house numbers painted on the curb have not been approved by your association, and therefore, are not acceptable, so please do not let a solicitor talk you into having it done in front of your house.


2010 Sales Tax Holiday August 13 through August 15, 2010

lorida law directs that no sales tax or local option taxes (discretionary sales surtax) will be collected on sales of books, clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$50 or less, or on certain school supplies for \$10 or less. This three day tax exemption is in effect from 12:01a.m., Friday, August 13, 2010, through midnight, Sunday, August 15, 2010.

The sales tax exemption applies to each eligible book or item of clothing selling for \$50 or less and to each eligible school supply item selling for \$10 or less. The exemption applies regardless of how many items are sold on the same invoice to a customer.

However, the exemption does not apply to books or to any item of clothing selling for more than \$50, or to any school supply item selling for more than \$10.




TEST YOUR ALARM SYSTEM

Periodic testing of your alarm system is essential to ensure proper function. Residents should test their system each month. There are two types of tests to perform: testing the operation within your home and testing the signal transmission from your home to the Central Station.

Testing the operation of all door and window contacts, and motion detectors:

- 1. Verify that your system is in "ready" mode. Do not arm it.
- Open each protected door or window, one at a time.
- Check to see that the keypad displays the door or window you are testing is open.
- Close the respective door or window. The keypad should display "ready."
- Repeat this procedure for each sensor in the system.



Some systems are programmed to transmit monthly timer tests to the Central Station. You can check online or call Devcon to see if your system has reported a monthly timer test or:

- Call Devcon Security's Community Association Service Center at 800-878-7806 to place your system in "test" mode. You must give your password to the operator.
- Arm your system and cause an alarm by opening a door or window, or by tripping a motion detector. Allow the alarm to sound for at least one minute.
- Turn off your system and reset it to "ready" mode.
- Call Devcon to verify that the signal was received and <u>take your</u> <u>system off test</u>.

Important: changing your telephone service to digital cable or VOIP can affect the communication of your security system. Please call us in advance to discuss this. When your new telephone service is installed, always have the telephone technician call Devcon while on site to test your system. Adding DSL service to your phone line requires that you add a DSL filter to your security system.


